### CalVet Hires Homeless Coordinator



Veronica Badillo, of Merced, has been hired as the Homeless Coordinator in Veterans Services Division. Veronica is a US Army veteran currently serving as a Staff Sergeant, a Healthcare Non-Commission Officer in the U.S. Army Reserves. Veronica has been mobilized twice in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. After moving to Sacramento, CA she attended CSU Sacramento. She graduated from CSU Sacramento in 2007 with a B.A. degree in Ethnic Studies. As a veteran, she is aware of the many challenges faced by recently separated veterans and other service members trying to reintegrate back into civilian life, especially those returning home from a deployment.

## EXTENSION ON UNEMPLOYMENT CHECKS ARE APPROVED

A long-debated proposal to extend unemployment benefits through November won approval in the House of Representatives setting the stage for what is likely to become a top campaign issue as the November midterm election nears. A day after the Senate advanced the measure, the House voted 272-152 to send the benefits extension to the White House for President Obama's signature. The debate over the cost of the legislation – and the state of the nation's economy – continues to dominate House and Senate races across the country. The legislation extends benefits for those who have already used up their standard 26 weeks of unemployment.

## RULES FOR PTSD CLAIMS CHANGED

Under a new process for claiming post-traumatic stress disorder, veterans will no longer have to engage in actual combat to make the case they suffered psychologically in war. Instead, the new policy recognizes that living with the fear of death and injury may be enough for troops to develop mental health issues.

"With this new PTSD regulation we are acknowledging the inherently stressful nature of the places and circumstances military services, in which the reality and fear of hostile or terrorist activities is always present," Michael Walcoff, acting undersecretary for benefits for the VA, said during a press conference this morning at the VA headquarters in Washington DC.

Veterans will not have to cite specific incidents of stress -- a firefight or rocket attack, for instance - and then back up the claim with documentation. Instead, veterans will now have only to show that he or she served in a combat zone and had a job consistent with conditions related to their PTSD symptom. Walcoff said many more veterans will now be able to file claims for PTSD, including troops who did not have direct contact with the enemy.

## HUD and VA Launch \$15 Million Demonstration Program to Prevent Veteran Homelessness.

In an effort to prevent homelessness among Veterans, primarily those returning from the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced on Thursday that both agencies will invest a combined \$15 million in five selected communities near military installations. The HUD and VA grant funding is intended to provide housing assistance and supportive services to veterans who might otherwise be living in homeless shelters or on the streets.
